















Wyoming's community colleges provide dynamic, lifelong learning environments through higher education, workforce development, innovative partnerships, and civic and global engagement that lead to responsible citizenship and economic, social and cultural prosperity.



The eight **Wyoming Community Colleges** and the **Wyoming Community College Commission** (WCCC) are a creation of the Wyoming legislature per the Wyoming 1945 Constitution, Article 7.

WCCC's Mission and Purpose are to provide coordination, advocacy, funding, and accountability for the community college system on behalf of the State of Wyoming. Their actions include the distribution of legislative appropriations. Approximately 97% of WCCC's budget goes to the colleges' programs, services, campus operations, library funding, and Wyoming public television.

The Wyoming Association of Community College Trustees (WACCT) acts on behalf of Wyoming's community colleges with representatives from the governing board of every college.

Scholarships & Student Aid


The Wyoming's Tomorrow Scholarship was created to help working adults obtain the skills and education necessary to re-renter the workforce, move up in their current careers, or pursue new career paths, including any post-secondary certificate or degree up to the bachelor's level. The Hathaway Scholarship Program rewards eligible Wyoming students with scholarship money. Merit Awards per semester are available to high school graduates and other Wyoming residents who meet certain academic requirements. Need Awards above and beyond Merit Awards are available to those with unmet financial need.

Five schools encapsulate the credit program opportunities at Casper College that offer over 130 nationally accredited degree and certificate programs, including:


- School of Business and Industry

Advocacy

Central Wyoming advocates for Native American student-athletes. Surrounded by the Wind River Reservation, which is home to the Eastern Shoshone and Northern Arapaho tribes, CWC recognizes the relationship between sports and education for Native Americans. CWC, a federally recognized NASNTI, has athletic teams visit reservation schools to encourage kids to attend college, and requires all staff to participate in training about tribal history, culture, politics, and economics for Wind River.

Nursing

Our Nursing Program is #1 among all colleges in Wyoming, scoring a 92.09 on RegisteredNursing.org. With an experienced nursing faculty and our quality hands-on, team-based, active learning models, our students practice real-world medicine in a state-of-the-art simulation laboratory and become skilled at patient care through clinicals at neighboring facilities.

BAS Offerings

We have a robust portfolio of Bachelor of Applied Science offerings for students with a variety of interests, from Outdoor Program, Law Enforcement, Tribal, and Business & Entrepreneurial Leadership to Early Childhood Education.

Farmer Training Program

We want to help aspiring and beginning farmers grow nutritious foods by developing financially and environmentally sustainable farm businesses in central Wyoming. Our goal is to expand employment and business opportunities in agriculture while also providing our communities with affordable, sustainable foods.

Career Services

Our Career Services office guides student career development, which can include student employment, internships, job shadowing, and mentorship/informational interviewing. EWC is workforce-ready, offering a comprehensive range of Career and Technical Education (CTE) programs alongside robust transfer programming. Our CTE programs equip students with the hands-on skills needed to excel in today's dynamic job market, while our transfer programs provide a seamless pathway to four-year universities, ensuring academic and career success for all.

Career & Technical Education Programs

EWC's Career and Technical Education programs are designed to meet the needs of diverse industries, preparing students for high-demand, high-skill, and high-wage careers. Programs include the Modern Agricultural Program, which integrates cutting-edge technology to enhance farming practices; Veterinary Technology, equipping students with clinical skills to care for animals; and Gunsmithing, teaching the craftsmanship of firearm repair and customization. Other offerings include Cosmetology and Barbering, focusing on beauty and grooming techniques to obtain state licensures; Welding, emphasizing various welding methods and safety; Equine Science, exploring the care and management of horses; Nursing, with a strong record of graduate success. New programming includes Commercial Driver's License (CDL) Training, preparing students for careers in the transportation industry; and Health Care programs to include Certified Nursing Assistants (CNA) and Medical Assistants (MA). In addition, a new Construction Trades program that will be launched in the Fall of 2026 to meet the growing demand for skilled trades professionals. These programs combine rigorous coursework with hands-on experience, ensuring students are workforce-ready upon graduation.

Transfer Programs

EWC also offers robust transfer programs, enabling students to transition seamlessly to four-year universities. Whether pursuing a degree in Accounting, Agriculture, Arts, Business, Science, Education, or other related fields, students receive personalized advising to meet transfer requirements and ensure their success. EWC has strong partnerships with accredited institutions, thereby allowing student to effectively transfer credits as they move forward in completing their educational goals. Through the Wyoming Innovation Partnership (WIP), EWC has further strengthened its collaboration with industry partners across the state. These initiatives enhance workforce development by aligning education programs with Wyoming's economic priorities including economic growth. EWC is committed to fostering innovation in its education programs while simultaneously meeting the needs of the state and regional industries for a more vibrant workforce. WIP has enabled EWC to expand opportunities for students through access to internships, apprenticeships, and direct industry engagement. Virtual Reality

A 24-seat state-of-the-art virtual reality lab is at the forefront of several mine training programs housed out of the Gillette College Technical Education Center. Partnerships have been forged with the local industry to provide one-of-a-kind mine safety training specific to each mine. Visitors and local history buffs can also see the virtual reality programming at the local history museum, the Rockpile Museum, which is showcasing a local mine tour, all through the help of their virtual reality goggles. The possibilities are endless with this incredible technology.

Veterans

No matter what program of study our student veterans choose, 99% graduate. This is thanks to the incredible work of the Veteran Services Center and the incredible support Gillette College has for veterans. Gillette College is also home to The American Legion, Post 307 – the only American Legion Post of its kind. Founded at the Gillette Campus, Post 307 is a student organization that provides our student veterans with referrals, support, training, and networks to enhance and develop their student and career opportunities and gives them a voice within their local, state, and national governments.

Nursing

The Gillette College nursing program boasts an impressive employment rate upon graduation for nursing students, at almost 100%. The local hospital partnerships allow for a nearly seamless transition into the workforce, as well as many other clinical partnerships locally. Students receive hands-on training in our advanced, high-tech simulation centers and complete extensive clinical training at healthcare facilities around the region. Through our partnership with the University of Wyoming, students also have the option to take courses toward a Bachelor of Science Degree in Nursing and have access to individual advising sessions with a trained RN/BSN Completion Advisor.

Academic Pathways

LCCC has adopted the Guided Pathways model to provide our students with clear, structured educational experiences that are designed to lead to high-quality postsecondary credentials and careers. At LCCC there are eight academic Pathways: Agriculture & Equine; Business & Accounting; Communications & Creative Arts; Health Sciences & Wellness; Human & Public Service; Information Technology; Science, Technology, Engineering & Math (STEM); and Trades & Technical Studies.

Wyoming Innovation Partnership Collaboration

Laramie County Community College continues to collaborate with the State to develop programs in entrepreneurship, energy, technology, tourism, and more as part of the Wyoming Innovation Partnership. WIP has significantly impacted LCCC by enhancing programs in manufacturing, health care, technology, and entrepreneurship. The Concept Forge, expanded through WIP funding, provides tools like 3D printers and robotic training for workforce development, while investments in health care, like LCCC's new practical nursing program, and AI programming support innovation in crucial sectors. Additionally, WIP's focus on entrepreneurship and the creative economy bolsters local startups, small businesses, and artists in Wyoming.

Location

LCCC is located at the crossroads of I-80 and I-25, providing students exposure to a variety of employers and career opportunities in Wyoming and along the Front Range. At LCCC, we work to provide our students with immersion and applied learning experiences. Having access to a variety of industry and community partners allows our students to have hands-on learning experiences while they pursue their degree.

POINTS OF INTEREST

Addressing Community Needs

In its continuing effort to provide relevant academic offerings to the residents of its service area, Northwest College has conducted a Community Needs Survey to gain a comprehensive understanding of regional perspectives, demographics, service levels, and county-level labor market needs. A Regional Needs Data Assessment with Academic Portfolio Optimization are also part of the process, focusing on how NWC's existing programs compare to state and regional workforce trends, and what academic programs are well placed or show the most potential. The results will assist the College in prioritizing and developing new programming and inform strategic investment.

New Pathways for Emergency Medical Services

Northwest College has added an additional pathway to earn a paramedic certificate, which allows working EMS professionals to complete the program in 14 to 15 months. The primary goal is to provide advanced emergency medical technicians with career mobility, and an avenue to provide safe, competent care as entry-level paramedics who serve the region's healthcare needs. For those students who have already earned a college degree and meet the prerequisites, the Paramedic S.C. allows them to pursue further education without needing to enroll in another degree-seeking program.

A New Home for Workforce Training

To meet the growing needs of its Center for Training and Development, Northwest College has entered into a five-year agreement with the Wyoming Military Department for use of the Powell Armory. The facility allows the College to better support existing programs such as the CDL, electrical, and plumbing/HVAC certifications with space designed for unique programmatic needs. The additional space also gives NWC the opportunity to expand its workforce offerings, and work with the WMD for the benefit of the community.

Sheridan College Innovation Center

The newly established Sheridan College Innovation Center spans 28,000 square feet and is designed to assist students and entrepreneurs in manufacturing, construction, and related fields. This facility is equipped with various training laboratories and advanced equipment aimed at fostering hands-on skill development that integrates industry standards, classroom learning, and practical experiences. The center features a Manufacturing Incubator that caters to the specific needs of individual creators, guiding their projects from initial concepts to viable, tangible outcomes.

Bachelor of Applied Science Degree in Management and Leadership

A new BAS in Management and Leadership offers two areas of emphasis from which to choose:

Business Emphasis

The Business emphasis is designed to equip students with essential skills and knowledge applicable to a wide range of careers. This track is particularly beneficial for individuals aiming to assume management roles or aspiring to start and run their own businesses. Students will learn to analyze complex business problems, develop effective solutions, and lead teams with confidence.

Industrial Technology Emphasis


The Industrial Technology emphasis is ideal for those interested in industrial trades and for those who may already possess an associate degree in applied fields such as agriculture, machine tool technology, hospitality and tourism, construction, diesel technology, or welding. This emphasis combines skills already acquired in the field with additional competencies required for management positions or for launching new businesses.

Software Development Program

Sheridan College's Associate of Science Degree in Software Development combines up-to-date programming languages, modern coding tools, and professional best practices with hands-on projects. Courses develop a wide range of skills that are sought after by employers, including Python, HTML/ CSS/JavaScript, mobile development, databases, DevOps, and security.

The program pairs students with business and industry partners to work on real-world projects that make use of the knowledge and skills acquired during classwork, so graduates learn the skills that employers want. The program is supported in part by the Wyoming Innovation Partnership and designed in partnership with the University of Wyoming and other Wyoming Community Colleges. Graduates may choose to enter the workforce or transfer seamlessly to the University of Wyoming.

Bachelor - Business Management

Every successful business needs effective leaders with industry knowledge and proven team managerial skills. In 2020, Western launched a Bachelor of Applied Science in Business Management to support economic growth in southwest Wyoming, focusing on industrial and organizational management. Cybersecurity

The Associate of Applied Science cybersecurity program and cybersecurity certificate are designed to prepare students for positions in the cybersecurity field. Courses equip students with the knowledge and skills needed for various positions in this high demand area. Students expand their understanding of security plans and policies, the importance of maintaining Confidentiality, Integrity, and Availability (the "CIA" of security), and the relationship between privacy and security, operating system security, network security. Flexible Education

Western is committed to student success. For students, the common theme "life got in the way" is a reality that impacts their educational performance. Our HyFlex initiative allows students to easily transition between face-to-face and online course delivery within the same course. If students must cover an extra shift at work or their car breaks down, they can stay on pace with the rest of their class. Plant Operations

The Plant Operations Program prepares students for careers in industrial plants and refineries as process technicians/operators, research technicians, or laboratory technicians. The program appeals to people who enjoy the challenges in using advanced computer technology and instrumentation to operate a variety of equipment systems and industrial processes. Process technology is the study and application of the scientific principles associated with the operation and maintenance of the chemical processing industry (CPI).
